

Hi Friends,

We are in, or are coming into, the dog days. Sometimes we call them the dog days of summer, sometimes the dog days of August. The Old Farmer's Almanac specifically identifies the dog days as being from July 3 to August 11 because this corresponds to the ancient heliacal rising (at sunrise) of the Dog Star Sirius. We really cannot put exact dates on the dog days based on a star. After all, every fifty years the stars shift one degree and in 13,000 years Sirius will rise in the winter. Still, that is the origin of the expression because the Romans called their hottest, most humid days the dog days, connecting it with Sirius, the brightest star in the constellation Canis Major, meaning large dog.

July or August or both, it makes no difference to me. The summer is hot and by mid-August I start anticipating the cooler days of autumn. Now, full disclosure, I am more of a winter than a summer person. I will take cold over hot any day. So, forgive me if I look longingly toward the fall.

Still, my temperature bias aside, I do like the expression dog days. Just as I am a winter person, I am also a dog person. They have many characteristics people would do well to emulate. For one thing, they are incredibly faithful. Dogs are not fickle or persnickety. You can depend on them sticking with you in thick or thin. They are good friends – always glad to see you and ready to go with you at a moment's notice. Dogs are forgiving. You do not experience dogs holding grudges or acting standoffish because they felt slighted. They are always prepared to invite you into their good graces. They are open to training and discipline, something Proverbs teaches us we should be. Dogs are also adaptable. Oh, they have their routines and habits, but they will adjust to new situations just so long as they can be with you.

This got me to thinking that maybe we can use the dog days to be more like dogs. How are we with our faithfulness – to God, to family and to those for whom we may have responsibility, to our work, in our church attendance and service and giving? Are we being good friends to others, glad to see them, ready to respond to them? How are we doing with forgiveness? The dog days might be good days to let go of grudges or hurts or bruised feelings and to invite others back into relationship with us. Are we continuing to study the scripture and to pray and to worship, allowing

God to train us in discipleship and to correct any missteps? Do we keep an open spirit, watching for new opportunities or new ways to serve the Lord and proclaim the gospel?

Summer is a good time for refreshment and recreation – taking a breath and bringing some order into our lives. It also, then, is a good time to realign our lives with the Lord, walking in the ways our savior would have us to work, and being the people God created us to be.

These are the lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer. These are also the dog days. Let's hear it for the dogs.

Our Learning Center has a Need

Out of my mind.....

Hello all, This is Marlin from down at the Learning Academy in the upstairs of the Youth Chapel, aka the tutoring center. The tutoring center is self-sustaining and receives no funding from the church. Other than the operating expenses and salaries, we have a Scholarship Fund I am making my once-a-year appeal for donations to that Scholarship Fund. This fund covers the cost of tutoring for students whose families cannot pay. We have averaged at least two students at all times since we opened 11-1/2 years ago.

About two years ago, all donations stopped and the fund ran down to \$ 0.00. We pledged, however, to never turn away a student for lack of funds. In this two-year period, there has been six students tutored. At the risk of going too serious on you all, I had to work for free for six months last year to allow these students to be tutored. Simply, I pay for the scholarship kids out of my pocket so we do not have to turn anyone away.

I am asking for some donations so that this situation does not come back for the second half of the current year. All donations are totally tax deductible.
