Blessed Easter Season.

I was going to offer the salutation of happy spring but I do not know. I thought spring had come exceptionally early this year, but I am writing this from my home office while it continues to snow and sleet outside. With April upon us, perhaps spring is both officially and actually here. I hope.

What I do know is that Easter is just a few weeks away. Not long ago we gathered to begin the season of Lent by receiving the mark of ashes and remembering our mortality. Now we prepare to gather to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and the promise of eternal life. What a difference a few weeks make.

I do hope you will take advantage of the many opportunities to make this season one of spiritual blessing. On April 9 our worship will begin with the waving of palms in grand procession along with bright and soul-stirring music. We will gradually move toward a more somber tone as the cheers welcoming Jesus to Jerusalem become jeers seeking his crucifixion. On Thursday the 13th we symbolically gather in the Upper Room to share the bread and cup and will move from there to the Garden of Gethsemane. On Friday we will follow Jesus from the garden to the house of the high priest for his mock trial and then to Pilate's Hall and ultimately to Golgatha. (We have services at noon on both Thursday and Friday for those who cannot come in the evening. The evening services are at 7:30). Easter morning begins at the cemetery literally for sunrise service at 6:30. We will meet at the cemetery figuratively at 8, 9:30, and 11:00. To shouts of He Is Risen, we will share the greatest news ever told

On Saturday evening we are honoring the ancient church tradition of receiving our confirmands into church membership. This is a beautiful service and a significant time in the lives of these young people. All are welcome to attend.

Holy Week this year is also spring break for some of our school systems. I know this means that some of you will be traveling. Be safe and enjoy yourselves. Let me encourage you to find a church wherever you are and check for services so that may participate in Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter.

Much happens after Easter. Later in the month we have the Women's Retreat. (Have you registered yet?) Upcoming on Sunday mornings is a Children's Sabbath, a Women's Day, a Mission Celebration Sunday, and Senior Sunday (graduating seniors, not the life-experienced seniors). The bottom line is that you want to be here every Sunday that you possibly can

Thanks to all who provided snacks for the Rock the House after school ministry by Faith Connections. Our congregation collected 100 servings per week of snacks for the month of April.

Anyone interested in The Baltimore Christian Workcamp?

The BCCW was founded by two United Methodist ministers in 1984. In 2017, the week will be July 16 -21, our 34th year. There is a kick-off dinner on Sunday evening at Hunt's UMC, the host church. Each work day starts with breakfast prepared by members from a local church at the host church. The volunteers then prepare their own bagged lunches, go out to sites, and then have dinner that evening at local churches. All types of work (e.g., ramps, plumbing, electrical, carpentry, roofing, interior and exterior painting, caulking, inside and outside clean-up) are performed by workers of all ages. Sleeping accommodations at the host church can be available only for supervised large groups traveling from out of the region. Individuals must have their own medical/health insurance to participate.

Anyone over 16 and willing to work may register. Fee is \$25 per week or \$6 per day. Church groups are asked to donate at least \$100 for building materials. (In addition, there are planning meetings held throughout the year at Hunt's Memorial UMC.)




Damascus Heritage Society Museum Gary Richard's Collections continues Open February - May 2017

History Nugget: When hematite ore was discovered in the Catoctin Mountains in the 1770's, the Catoctin Furnace was constructed to produce pig iron. It is reported that during the Revolutionary War, cannons and cannonballs were cast at this furnace for George Washington's Army and 100 tons of shells were used at Yorktown. Iron made at the Catoctin Furnace was also used to make machinery for the invention of the steamboat, metal plates for the Civil War Vessel Monitor and the manufacture of car wheels. The Furnace was blown out for the last time in February 1903. The Catoctin Furnace is a remnant of a thriving-iron industry. It remains a stark reality to the life and death of a part of history eliminated by technological advances and the economics of business. Come experience this piece of living history for yourself!


