Joyous Easter!

We begin the month of April with the joyful celebration of the resurrection of our Lord. Ash Wednesday this year fell on Valentine's Day creating the potentially odd mix of ashes, chocolates and roses. Easter falls on April Fools' Day. At first I was put off by the thought of the most important day on the Christian calendar having to share space with a silly, inauspicious day such as April Fools'. After some reflection, however, I like the conjunction.

April Fools' is about deceit and trickery, albeit done in fun, to convey a sense of foolishness. Who can be fooled by our trickery? The resurrection seemed like an April Fools' joke to many, including Jesus' own disciples. We are not surprised that the religious leaders responsible for the crucifixion paid the soldiers guarding the tomb to lie about what they had witnessed. After all, their reputations were at stake. The resurrection would be proof that they had made a terrible mistake. What is surprising is the initial response of the disciples.

The women were the first to experience the resurrection. It is hard to say exactly which women since the different gospel writers differ on just who was at the tomb. What is consistent is that some of the followers of Jesus, women in particular, went to the tomb to prepare Jesus' body for final burial. He had been hastily buried Friday evening and what preparations were done were done by, well, men. I suspect the women were not confident the preparations were properly done or done with the care that would guide their efforts. Whatever the motivation, some women were at the tomb early Sunday morning to finish the work of burial. Of course, they discovered the tomb empty and were given the angelic message that Jesus had risen and was alive.

Filled with both excitement and terror, they ran to tell the men just what had happened. The men should not have been surprised. After all, Jesus had told them on more than one occasion that he would rise on the third day. The surprise was that they were not already at the tomb. The women's witness should have confirmed what they should have been expecting. Instead, Luke tells us that the men considered the women's report to be "an idle tale." It was as if they expected the women to suddenly say "April Fools!". Only when Jesus presented himself to them and scolded them for their disbelief, did they grasp that the women's report was not a prank.

The religious leaders did not believe it because they did not want to believe it. The disciples did not believe it because they could not believe it. In both cases it felt like an April Fools'

experience. A growing number today talk about the resurrection as if it were an April Fools' prank, one we should not be fooled by. The opposite is true. It is foolish not to believe that Jesus rose from the dead and lives today as Lord and Savior. Foolish because, if Jesus did not rise, we have no hope of life after death. Foolish because, if Jesus did not rise, we are still captive to the powers of sin and death. Foolish mostly because, Jesus is Lord of the earth whether or not we believe, and discounting the witness of the resurrection as an April Fools' type prank is to put ourselves at odds with the one coming to judge the quick and the dead. Easter falling on this silly date thus becomes a reminder that this is no joke.

On April 1 in worship the trumpets will lead us in proclaiming Christ the Lord is risen today. We will boldly celebrate the good news of the resurrection and the promise that because Christ lives we shall live also. We will lift our hands in praise for the grace and mercy that has been bestowed on us. What we will not do is end the service by saying April Fools'. No, this is no idle tale. This is a truth that changes everything. Come and celebrate with us.

That will continue. We know Rev. Woodrow is coming and she is an excellent pastor. We know someone else will join her and he/she will have gifts that will bless this church.

All will be well. Besides, this is the Lord's church. You are in the hands of our Lord, and the Lord is not going anywhere.





For a little more than a year now a group of volunteers from DUMC have spent one day in the spring and fall to do general clean-up and maintenance work at the Laytonsville homeless facility. Located only a short 15 minute drive from Damascus, this is an opportunity to make a real difference and improve the living conditions for people from our local community who are in need. During past workdays we have raked leaves, mulched and edged gardens, trimmed trees, cleaned gutters, repaired raised gardens, planted vegetables in the raised garden and painted interior rooms in the houses on the property. This Spring we will be doing similar work.

The residents at this facility are very appreciative of the work we do to improve their quality of life. One resident remarked about how much she enjoys being able to take care of the vegetable garden and have fresh vegetables from their own garden with meals – an experience some at the home have never had.

A Heart for Serving Others—THE HEARTS ARE FILLING THE HALL WALLS!

During Lent, the Missions Team is distributing pink paper hearts, inviting DUMC people to write their Lenten "service" and the nature of it, i.e., "Worked at the Food Bank, Took a neighbor to the doctor, Cooked a meal for someone with a death in the family," etc., on a pink heart. (More hearts are available if people do more than one act of service during Lent. They are in the hallway outside the Great Hall and in the Narthex of the Sanctuary.) 




