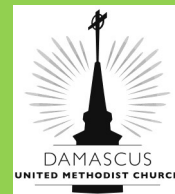

May you enjoy Sabbath time and the goodness of God’s creation this summer!

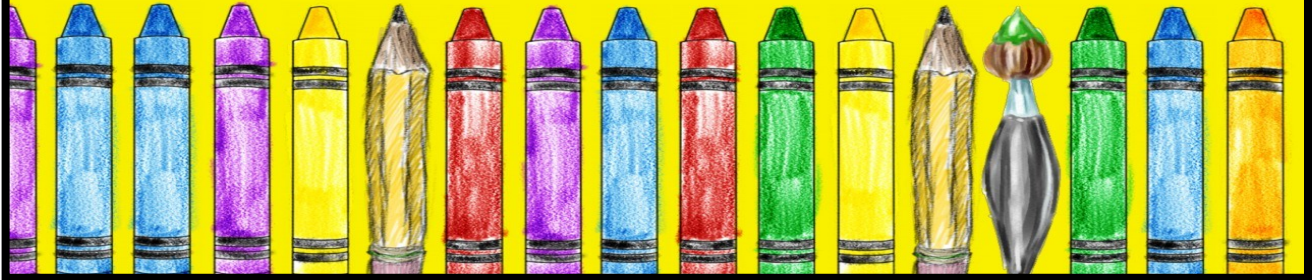

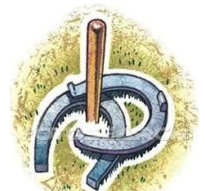

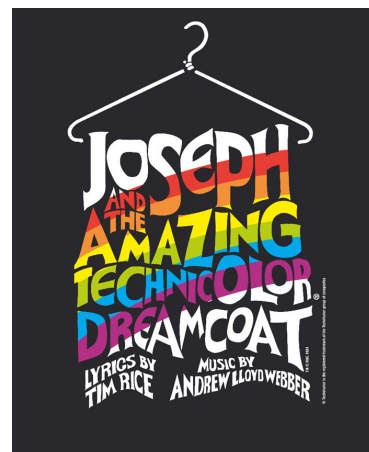

## Volunteers in Missions Fall trip

### **VOLUNTEER IN MISSION TRIP: SECOND TEAM MEETING AUGUST 12 @ 10:45 am -- ANNEX/CHURCH OFFICE**

This fall, October 7-13, a team of volunteers will travel to Tarboro, NC, to work on homes damaged by Hurricane Matthew in the fall of 2016. This hurricane did \$15.09 billion in damages from Venezuela, north to NYC. The hardest hit states were Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, and North Carolina. People who want to help with all manner of repairs, and if any have bonafide trade skills, or no trade skills, are invited to participate. We will be staying at a center in Tarboro, outfitted with bunk beds by UMCOR; we will prepare our own meals. Cost is \$150 per person for room, board, and travel. In response to the overwhelming devastation caused by Hurricane Matthew in October of 2016, the NC Conference United Methodist Disaster Recovery Ministries has set up 5 disaster centers in eastern NC. Hundreds of volunteers have mucked out hundreds of flooded homes and reconstruction is in progress. Some homes still need to be mucked out and sprayed for mold. While, in other cases, volunteers are needed to repair houses: replace floors, insulation, ceilings, roofs, drywall, porches, decks. Disaster Response has begun building new replacement homes. Each center has a site manager, construction manager, and case manager who coordinate and oversee the volunteer work.

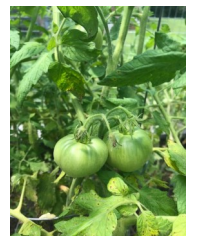

## Notes Received (cont'd):

Dear friends at DUMC,

We want to say thank you for your thoughts and prayers during this time of turmoil for Nicaragua. It's been almost 3 months since the violence began over protests to social security reform. More than 300 lives have been lost, and many more were injured or are missing. Many have lost their jobs, and safety in the streets is no longer guaranteed. Roadblocks are being used as a form of protest in many parts of Managua (esp near universities) and around the country. International human rights groups are here investigating the deaths, and the Catholic Church is mediating dialogues between the government, student groups and civil society.

The La Danta church community is doing well in spite of the situation. They have had a good rainy season and are hopeful for a plentiful first harvest in August. There are no roadblocks near them, so they can get to the market. What is most worrisome is rising food prices for the basics other than what they grow, because of the lack of access for vehicles. They send their love, prayers and greetings for their sisters and brothers at DUMC.

Our second daughter Julia Isabella arrived on May 29th in the midst of all of this, and has been a beacon of hope and light for us. We give thanks to God that we were able to make it safely to the hospital and that she was born at a healthy 7 lbs 15 oz (two weeks early!). Thank you so much for the baby shower fund, that was very thoughtful and we are so grateful!

Memo and I have made the decision to relocate our family to MD for 6 months starting in August. We feel that Managua, especially at night, is no longer a safe space for raising young children. Eduardo and Luis will continue the work of Between Cultures here in Nicaragua, and we will stay in close contact with them. We have faith in God that this struggle will lead to a better future for the country, but in the meantime we look forward to connecting and spending time with the DUMC community in these upcoming months.

Nicaragua needs solidarity and support more than ever, and we continue to ask for your active prayers and positive energy to bring an end to the violence and find a peaceful resolution for this humble country that so many of us love so much.

Hi, Carol,

Thanks for your concern and it has been a terrible couple of weeks. As the OAS pressures the Nicaraguan government to stop the violence, the violence continues. So many deaths, so much polarization, so many obstacles to reach justice and reconciliation or even an immediate solution. It is amazing how quickly everything has escalated.

We are doing as well as can be expected, and remain safe and mostly at home, but are deeply saddened by the events and so many people we know and don't know who have been affected. I share Bible study time with Amanda and other missionaries (we have taken to doing it over Skype or Whatsapp since we have been unable to meet in person due to insecurity) and she shared that they were planning some time away in the US. A sound decision given the circumstances. Our youngest daughter will be leaving for college in August which is kind of a relief, too. Our eldest was hoping to work in Nicaragua for a year, but we are giving that some time before we look at alternatives.

Your prayers are welcome, there is not a whole lot more to be done at the moment, but I do encourage all groups and supporters of Nicaragua, AMC or whatever ministerial connection is, to continue sending support both financial and spiritual. It means a lot in times like these. Surprisingly, AMC's project sites which are located in some of the most socially unstable parts of the country, are enjoying relative calm and projects and grants are underway with only some limitations. Damascus UMC support for the dental workers is also giving results. I have been remiss in getting more information to you, but a young dental worker named Yassir Obregon has been developing his skills and practice and goes out regularly with Ministry of Health mobile teams to really far out places to offer extractions. I have helped to train this young man and he also apprentices with his father, Secundino Obregon. He was a young man on a bad path, so this opportunity has helped to turn his life around.

We are also grateful for your prayers, both personal and in church. And we still find time to celebrate global events that give us perspective like the three young missionaries in the Philippines who are now safely home. And Eritrea and Ethiopia are getting along after decades of strife. So hope remains in the midst of anguish.

Grateful for your message, I hope your vacation travels are a time of rest, relaxation and fun!

We started our February 2018 Finance Committee Report by saying, “We have very good news to report on 2017 ... after three years of declining income ... our terrific congregation responded with increased giving that wiped out the projected deficit, balanced the 2017 budget (giving) us confidence that our 2018 Budget will be balanced.” This strong pattern of giving has, for the most part, continued, and we are pleased to report that by the end of June, half way through the fiscal year, all bills were paid including our apportionment payments to the Conference. WE CAN REPORT THAT DR. WOODROW AND PASTOR BENJAMIN WERE VERY PLEASED TO RECEIVE THEIR FIRST FINANCIAL UPDATE ON DUMC. Please keep up the good work.

Having said that, we are now in the annual “summer slump” and income has fallen below budgeted projections. We urge you to:

- We had a very successful plant sale that helps fund a number of DUMC’s missions in our community and around the world.
- The Charles Wesley Singers had a wonderfully successful Summer Mission Tour touching the lives of hundreds of people from here to Florida and back.
- A team from DUMC continued our long history of service to the people of Garrett County this summer through their work with Habitat for Humanity.

In closing, let me say we will never be able to do everything we want to do to further God’s work on earth; however, each of us can work to meet and hopefully exceed our commitments to support the work of DUMC in our community, our nation, and around the world.

## **But Remember, There Are Many Ways to Give to DUMC**

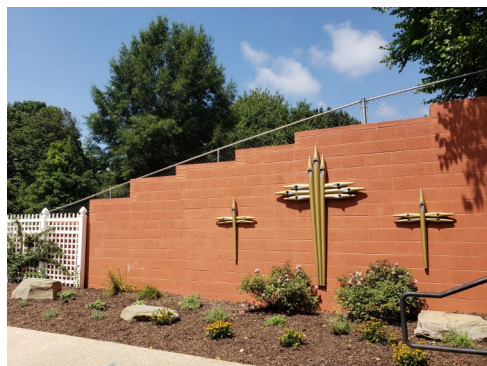
Damascus United Methodist Church wants to meet your needs on how you would like to make your tithe and offerings to the church. Please use the method that best fits your needs.

- You can bring your check/cash to services on Sunday and put your offering in the collection plate
- You can set up with your bank to send the church a bank draft for the frequency and amount you determine.
- You can download the church smart device application and go to the option to digitally give to the church. The instructions to set this up are intuitive once you are on that portion of the church app.
- You can text giving to the church. This can be set up by texting the word GIVE to the phone number (240) 428-6258. Once you do this you will get a response on how to set this up for future giving. Once set up you can then text OPTIONS to that phone number and it will give you the various options how much and to which fund that offering should be credited.
- You can call the church office bookkeeping department and set up e-Giving using a credit card, this can be done either monthly or twice a month based on your needs. Your credit card account will be charged the amount and frequency you determine.
- You can call the church office bookkeeping department and set up e-Giving using your bank ACH (automated clearing house). This can be done on a monthly or every two week period based on the amount and frequency you determine.
- You can donate stock. This is a win-win situation for you and the church. You
- bypass paying the capital gains tax if the stock value has grown. Call the bookkeeping office to find out more.
- If you are 70 ½ or older you can give your Required Minimum Distribution or a portion of it to the church and won't pay the tax on the distribution. Talk to your financial advisor on how to do this.

### Victory Haven Apartments

Construction of the Victory Haven apartments across New Church Street from DUMC is anticipated to commence in September 2018. The sale of the property by the Boyer family to Victory Housing, Inc. (VHI) was finalized at the end of June. VHI serves as the affordable housing development arm of the Archdiocese of Washington. More information can be found on their website [www.victoryhousing.org](http://www.victoryhousing.org)



The complex will include 72 apartments in a 4-story, L-shaped building. The rentals will be to seniors age 55 and up. Rent will be a sliding scale based on income. Victory Haven residents and guests will have dedicated parking on site, but in the event of overflow, they will be allowed to use the parking spaces on New Church Street temporarily. These spaces were always part of a shared easement with the Boyer (now VHI) property. The artist's sketch shows the view from Main Street; our church is located beyond the building. Because the property slopes down from New Church Street, only 2 ½ to 3 stories will be seen from the church. The project will probably take 18 months to complete. Will some disruption affect DUMC? Of course, but all parties will work to limit it as much as humanly possible. They must tie into a sewer pipe under New Church Street which will be inconvenient and likely messy. But it's for a short time, and then the street will be restored to its present state. After the project is complete, DUMC Trustees are planning to patch holes and repair the street, and if enough funds are available, repave the entire asphalt. The Trustees negotiated for VHI to share in this expense. Further, VHI will also contribute to our annual snow removal costs and they've pledged to work with us to limit any construction activity during regular services and special events. The project's primary construction access is off Main Street, not New Church Street; however, some deliveries of equipment may be made via New Church Street, but these will be kept to a minimum. The parking lot will be re-striped after construction and repaving of the street are done. Also, the path to the Youth Chapel will be relocated by VHI because it currently resides on their property.

Please look at this as an opportunity for DUMC. There will be a new population of potential members right next door! Our new neighbors may join us for Welcoming Wednesday dinners. Although no youth will live at Victory Haven, the residents may have children and grandchildren in the area. Let's welcome them into our community!

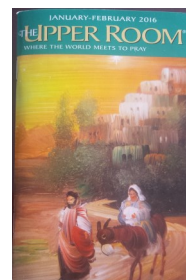
