

It's in the message



Whether it is an urban, suburban, or rural context the message of the gospel is the same. That is the lesson I have learned after completing my first year at DUMC. Wow, where has the year gone? I digress. Having spent my entire life living an urban and somewhat suburban reality, I would have never considered pastoring in a small town with farm land and tractors riding in the streets. Although I'm still adjusting, I suppose my reality set in, as I found myself walking in the Celebrate Damascus parade and thought to myself, yeah, we are really doing this. That thought was confirmed by a few shouts of "Pastor B!" from the crowd along the parade route. Here I was walking in a parade as the Associate Pastor of DUMC in this small town and having a great time. Is this a dream or someone's idea of a bad joke? What is happening? But I remembered the words of scripture that confirmed my call to ministry found in gospel of John, "The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." (John 3:8, NRSV)

What was happening was that I was experiencing a profound—often unrecognized and or ignored—way in which the Holy Spirit was at work. Yes, at the parade in the street God was present, because we were being the church and having a great time doing it. We decided that we would be a part of this community event. No, it was not the first, but my first time. But we presented our church without a band or a decorated float—we did have a nice new van—or anything thing that we thought was necessary to draw attention in a parade. ⇒⇒⇒⇒

Remember the story of Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey? Our decision to be in this community event, one that people get really excited about yearly, was simply to be present. What was profound—where the Holy Spirit was at work—was in the message that was given to us to share with the community. The message was, from my perspective, simple, irrefutable, and captivating. Moreover, it spoke to the very foundation of our faith. Just as God did for us in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we too must make “Love is our first response.” What a powerful and uncontroversial message for a church to proclaim to the community today!

I couldn't really tell if my energy and excitement came from the shouts of “Pastor B”—they could only be heard faintly over the shouts of “Miss Cora!”—or being out in the community with the people, or seeing the faces of people light up when they read the message on our signs. It was as if the message gave people a reassurance and, I dare say, reminded them that the church has not forgotten its mission, to spread the message of God's love in the world. Their faces said yes, that church gets it! Now, that's the church, in the small town, that I am proud to say that I have the privilege to be a part of the pastoral staff.

Bring Christ's Care to Hurting People – Become a Stephen Minister

Are you looking for a way to share Christ's love and compassion? Stephen Ministry provides the opportunity to receive training in listening and caring. A Stephen Minister at DUMC and Friendship is part of a vibrant support group of trained care givers. Each Stephen Minister is matched with a care receiver to meet one-on-one for about an hour a week. The role of the Stephen Minister is to listen, encourage, and support. Stephen Ministers are not "fixers of problems" and are not expected to have all the answers but are trained to walk beside a hurting person who is finding his or her way through a difficult period.

Active Stephen Ministers currently meet once a month to continue our education and to support each other. All areas of this ministry are completely confidential.

Please prayerfully consider whether God may be calling you to become a Stephen Minister. We are currently filling positions in the 2019/2020 training session, which meets once weekly from Sept. through February.



HOPI VIM Update

A team of 4, representing 3 churches in the Baltimore Washington Annual Conference, traveled to the Hopi reservation from July 5 through July 15. The team cleaned, sorted and organized 2 classrooms and 3 store-rooms of the Peace Academic Center (formerly the Hopi Mission School) in Kytosmovi village on Third Mesa. The school is the only Christian school on the reservation. It currently offers a GED program in cooperation with the Coconino County Community College and plans to hold classes for preschool and kindergarten when school opens on August 12.

At the request of The Hopi Foundation, the team also helped public radio station KUYI setup signs and stage equipment for a fund raising concert.

The team consisted of Norm and Cheryl Minekime (DUMC), Jill Maisch (Covenant UMC) and Belinda Norton (Mt. Zion UMC.)

Dr. Belinda Forbes, dentist ministry, in Nicaragua: Visiting DUMC, Sunday, November 17

As a congregation we provide salary support for Dr. Forbes out of our Mission Budget (\$1,500) along with a number of other congregations across our denomination. Belinda is from New England and has been doing dental mission work in Nicaragua for more than 25 years. She works with a team of people who provide assistance to nine rural communities in eastern Nicaragua on the Caribbean side of the country. There are no roads to these villages. Her team consists of a dentist, a physician (her husband), an agriculturalist, a social worker, and a disaster relief coordinator. We also made a commitment to support the training of new dental assistants @ \$1,000 a year in these rural communities for 5 years.

Belinda will be with us in worship and during the Sunday School hour will dialogue with us and share recent information on the ministry in Nicaragua.

Between Cultures Nicaragua Updates

Dear DUMC community,

As many of you know, Memo, Sophia, Julia & myself are continuing to reside in Damascus as we discern and pray for the situation in Nicaragua. **Between Cultures** continues its work in Nicaragua despite the current hardships. I'm excited to share with you some of the latest news. In gratitude, Amanda Jones-Dominguez

At the beginning of July Church of the Covenant in Boston sent a delegation of 4 to Nicaragua to hear about the new reality of the country since April 2018, and to visit their sister community of Dulce Nombre de Jesus.



DUMC's sister community of La Danta sends greetings & gratitude for the donation of 900 pounds of rice and 900 pounds of beans, benefitting 47 families and providing food for roughly a month. This donation was made possible thanks to the coffee and donut sales at DUMC the first of each month.

La Danta's community letter:

May God pour blessings on you all, especially the children and youth. And may God look on you with love in your schooling and work, both inside and outside of the home. We know we are one family participating in the same culture of working together to bring about the Kingdom and People of God. We thank you with love for your show of solidarity during this difficult time that our country is facing. We think of all those who have visited here often in our community. We also want to share that we have put down a beautiful tile flooring in our church and now have better electricity in the building. We hope that you would send a delegation soon. We are also managing the revolving agricultural loan program well. We started it with \$2,200 and now because of the interest collected over the years have a total of \$4,087 to loan out for the first and second harvests of 2019.

Come and join us on an AWARE Mission Trip! **AWARE** stands for Alternative Work-Study And Reality Experience. This program provides educational and work experiences for Mexican and international visitors, volunteers, and teams. The AWARE program is designed for adults of all ages, immersing them in the reality of life in rural Mexico as it relates to the issues of hunger, poverty, development and global awareness. This cross-cultural experience focuses on the needs of villagers and farming families and the Church's response through Christian outreach; sustainable agriculture; community development; health issues; creation stewardship; and church and faith development.

There are two new proposed options for attending with an AWARE group this year; **September 20 - 28** and another from **November 29 - December 7**. The September dates are an accompaniment delegation with the new class of Health Promoters. We hope you will give this careful consideration. If you decide to come, please try to bring a friend(s).

FROM THE BOARD OF GLOBAL MINISTRIES

**On Sunday, June 30 the Board asked all UM congregations to observe
A Sunday Of Solidarity for Suffering Children. DUMC participated in that national call.
The special Sunday observance asked all of us to do the following:**

In light of the recent news about children in U.S. government holding facilities along the U.S.-Mexico border, the United Methodist Committee on Relief has received numerous requests to respond. We have heard the plea for action from the church. Unfortunately, the facilities in question are managed in such a way that precludes even UMCOR's assistance. Access to these government facilities is extremely limited. As the arm of The United Methodist Church mandated to cultivate and promote mission, the General Board of Global Ministries offers tools to use as you confront the frustration and helplessness that this situation evokes. While this particular case is in the U.S., we recognize that migration is a global issue and the breadth and depth of our Global Migration programming at UMCOR and Global Ministries reflects that fact. As a church that is united on the need to care for children, we can be in mission together in three ways:

PRAY--We encourage you to pray for children. Below, you will find a prayer to use in your personal devotion practice or in a group gathering.

ACT--We encourage you to act on behalf of children. While we cannot take UMCOR hygiene kits to the U.S. government holding centers, we are distributing UMCOR hygiene kits at transitional shelters all along the US-Mexico border. In the last three months, UMCOR delivered 46,128 hygiene kits to six church-run transitional shelters. Instructions on how to make and send these kits are on the UMCOR website.

You can also act by calling or writing your U.S. elected officials. The General Board of Church and Society, our sister United Methodist agency responsible for advocacy, will give you some suggestions on issues to raise with these officials.

GIVE--Finally, we encourage you to give on behalf of children. Through the [Global Migration Advance](#), UMCOR provides grants to organizations along the U.S. border and elsewhere around the world that are working to fill gaps in the needs and rights of migrants. Jesus implored his disciples to welcome the children. **This is our mission:** to make sure the children are welcomed. Thank you for your prayers, your actions and your gifts.

God of all Children Everywhere,

Our hearts are bruised when we see children suffering alone.

Not just because "the Bible tells them so" but because they have known Your love in real and tangible ways, and they know that nothing, absolutely nothing, can separate them from Your love. Amen.


