Of Jesse's Lineage Coming...



One of the most beautiful hymns of the Advent season is *Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming*. The words of the hymn refer to the images found in writings of the prophet Isaiah which Christians

have interpreted to be a foretelling of the coming of Jesus: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." (Is. 11:1) Because Jesus belonged to one of the family branches descended from David, poets and artists through the millennia have visually depicted Jesus' genealogy as beginning with Jesse. So, we sing:

Lo, how a rose e'er blooming from tender stem hath sprung!
Of Jesse's lineage coming, as those of old have sung.
It came a floweret bright, amid the cold of winter when half spent was the night.

The image of the shoot growing from a stump, something that appears dead, is a sign of hope. That the shoot grows and even flowers is a miracle. In the seasons of Advent and Christmas, especially this year with so much chaos in the world around us, we choose to focus on hope. We can live hopeful and hope-filled lives because we know who ultimately rules our world: Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the Prince of Peace.

The hymn reminds us that even in times that seem dark and bleak, Jesus is there. Jesus comes to give us life and hope.

We hope that you will join us in this beautiful season as we gather to hear and to sing those the ancient words of scripture that promise us hope and joy through the birth of our Savior, Jesus. We have many wonderful

experiences planned. Take a look at all that is happening and plan to participate. You will be blessed by the experience as we remember that as God's children, we too are part of Jesse's lineage.

Tis' The Season

Recently I have been doing a lot of thinking and reflecting on church and community. In the wake of the devastating California camp fires, the heartbreaking horror in our community at Damascus High School, and all of the hidden unreported places where people are experiencing or dealing with a life challenge of some kind, I think about the African Proverb, "It takes a village...," the power of community, and the ways in which we live that out in our church community. The church universal has been facing its own share of challenges, and there is a tremendous amount of angst



about what will happen in our denomination after the special Conference in February, 2019. So I cannot help but wonder if the place that was once community for many of us is being threatened.

During Sunday school, I was talking with our 8th and 9th graders recently about the meaning of church. In our discussion I learned that, for some, as one them said, the church "are people who gather to do 'a thing'—pray, worship, [have bible study and so on], but [they] cannot always enjoy it...when [they] are being made to do it." We didn't get to determine if they thought church was important to them. I am concerned that possibly the importance or value of church is being lost in translation. I may be overreacting and forgetting that I was having a conversation with teenagers. But I say that's where the information may be getting lost. Are we taking the time and giving young people space to truly take hold of the value of church? Are we allowing them the opportunity to see that church is the place where they can be vulnerable and openly share our joys and cares and find support and strength to face life's challenges? Are they recognizing the power in the connection that we have with one another because of our shared belief in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ? Moreover, are we empowering them to define how they live that out for themselves? I'm just asking for a friend (lol).

As we talked, I was sharing with them how I am always amazed when I think about all the things that believers in the early church had to endure, as they committed themselves to learning and spreading the gospel. I would imagine that they couldn't wait to get to the places where they found commonality, and they could hear the scripture read, sing songs of praise, say prayers, and partake in the Lord's Supper. They went to those small houses, yes, because they had to, but the reason had more to do with just going to church. Belonging to that community was life giving. Has that meaning of church gotten lost? Have we become matter of fact about what our church means to the community and the world?

The Gospel according to John tells us Jesus said, "I came that you might have life and have it more abundantly." However, in some ways we are seeing the work of the thief that comes to steal, kill and destroy. So as we go into this advent season, let us remember that the coming of the Christ means that we have abundant life and together, as a community, we are a source of abundant life—love, healing, and strength—for each other and the world. May we, in this season, celebrate the joy, the power, and value of being a part of the body of Christ and community of faith at DUMC.






