Beloved in Christ,

Advent is the first season of the new church year, the time when we prepare our hearts and spirits, our churches and our homes, for the celebration of Jesus' birth. The deep blue color that is now used during Advent is meant to separate it from the penitential purple that is used during Lent and to evoke the sense of night's darkness just beginning to vield to dawn.


Our theme for the Advent and Christmas seasons this year is "Journey to Bethlehem." Our theme is drawn from Adam Hamilton's book "The Journey: Walking the Road to Bethlehem." The focus scriptures are drawn from Matthew and Luke, chapters 1 and 2 in each Gospel, where we find the stories of Jesus' birth.

In worship we will travel, figuratively, from Nazareth to Bethlehem with several of the main characters in the Nativity story: Mary of Nazareth, Joseph of Bethlehem, and Elizabeth (Mary's older cousin, who is pregnant with John the Baptist). Of course, all along the way from Nazareth to

Bethlehem, we will travel with the Holy Spirit as we draw nearer to the manger and to Jesus.



We begin the Advent season filled with anticipation as we prepare, once again, to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. As we move through the days of Advent toward Christmas we will do so with a sermon series called "The Journey: Walking the Road to Bethlehem," based on the book of the same name by Adam Hamilton. On the first three Sundays of Advent we will consider the stories of Mary, Joseph, and Elizabeth, Mary's much older cousin. Join us as we consider how their journeys inform our own faith journey as we seek to draw closer to Jesus.



Earth Stewards Adopt A Road 2019 Cleanup Summary






