Devoted Servants, Drawn to Jesus, Dedicated to Making Disciples

Dear Friends,

As we enter what is often a cold, snowy, and gray month, I have been reflecting on bright spots. One such spot in February is Valentine's Day. This day of love and romance accompanied by cards, flowers, candy, and candlelight dinners warms an otherwise cold-time period. Is that why it was put on the calendar in February? No, there are actually two theories about that.

The day itself is actually the feast day for St. Valentine, in the same way that March 17 is the feast day for St. Patrick. The date was set to commemorate his martyrdom, which happened around the year 269.

Others say that it was more than that. As we know, many Christian-feast days and holy days were placed on or close to pagan celebrations with the intent to replace those pagan celebrations. Well, Lupercalia was just such a pagan celebration that occurred on February 15. What in the world is Lupercalia? It was a fertility festival dedicated to the Roman god of agriculture – Faunus. Roman priests, belonging to the order of Luperci, would gather at the cave where it was said the founders of Rome, Romulus and Remus, were cared for as infants by a she-wolf or lupa. There they sacrificed a goat for fertility and a dog for purification. They then cut the goat hide into strips, dipped them in the sacrificial blood, and went about Rome slapping women and crop fields with them to make them more fertile. After the Christianization of the Roman Empire, this practice was outlawed and the pope replaced it with St. Valentine's Day. I would call that an upgrade, but that's just me.

This really caught on in the Middle Ages, especially in France and England. Because the day coincided with the mating season of birds in these countries, the emphasis began to shift to romance and after 1400 there is evidence of Valentine greetings, poems, and cards. Today, over one billion cards are sent, making it the second largest card-sending day, behind only Christmas at 2.6 billion.

Valentine himself was a priest in Rome during the difficult reign of Claudius who persecuted Christians. Valentine was known to aid Christians being persecuted. The offense that led to his martyrdom was that he married Christian couples. Rome, a morally freewheeling society at that time, opposed marriage, primarily on the basis that married men would be reticent to serve in the military. The Church, of course, supported marriage, and Valentine followed the church. It literally cost him his life. Legend has it that he healed the daughter of a prison guard of blindness and that before his death he wrote her a note signed "From your Valentine."


Pastor's Article (cont'd)

Today Valentine is the Patron Saint of pledged couples, engaged couples, happy marriages, love, lovers, young people, and greetings. These all make sense to me. A little less obvious is that he is also the Patron Saint of beekeepers, epilepsy, fainting, plague, and travelers. I suppose we all have to multitask these days.

Wherever you fall on the romance scale, I think this is a good day to thank God for the love God shares with us, and to thank God for the love we receive, be it from spouses or parents or family or friends. It is also a good time to remember that Christ calls us to extend love in whatever ways we can. Everyone likes to hear the words that they are special, that they are loved. With whom might you share those words this Valentine's Day?

Happy Valentine's Day. You are special to me.




The Baltimore-Washington Conference will once again be offering college scholarships for the Fall 2017 semester. Students can

20 It was about that time that the mother of the Zebedee brothers came with her two sons and knelt before Jesus with a request.

21 "What do you want?" Jesus asked.

She said, "Give your word that these two sons of mine will be awarded the highest places of honor in your kingdom, one at your right hand, one at your left hand."

22 Jesus responded, "You have no idea what you're asking." And he said to James and John, "Are you capable of drinking the cup that I'm about to drink?"

They said, "Sure, why not?"

23 Jesus said, "Come to think of it, you *are* going to drink my cup. But as to awarding places of honor, that's not my business. My Father is taking care of that."

24-28 When the ten others heard about this, they lost their tempers, thoroughly disgusted with the two brothers. So Jesus got them together to settle things down. He said, "You've observed how godless rulers throw their weight around, how quickly a little power goes to their heads. It's not going to be that way with you. Whoever wants to be great must become a servant. Whoever wants to be first among you must be your slave. That is what the Son of Man has done: He came to serve, not be served—and then to give away his life in exchange for the many who are held hostage."

Tutoring Programs in Prison Ministry

There are new opportunities in 2017 for service at the Montgomery County Correctional Facility in Clarksburg:

- Tutoring Math and/or Language Arts with students who are working to pass the GED exam. Tutors can chose times during these hours on weekdays: 8-11 am, 1-4 pm, and 6-9 pm.
