


Greetings,

The Tea Room at Gambrill State Park on the ridge of the Catoctin Mountains will be the site of a Young at Heart picnic/cookout **on Wednesday, June 28.** If you haven't been there you'll be awestruck by the beautiful views of the Frederick and Middletown valleys and the South Mountain area to the west. The Tea Room is a lodge-like structure that has been a popular feature of the Park for over 75 years, hosting weddings, family reunions, business meetings and other special events.

### NEEMA (swahili "Grace") Kenya Missions

Jambo, rafikis! (Swahili for "Hello Friends!")

This month's feature is about the Ndere Orphans & Parental Care Program that the OMG group visited in January, 2017. It is a preschool located in the far western part of Kenya, near Lake Victoria. Wellington Otieno was a friend of it's founder and Sylvia Otieno conducted a children's book drive for it a few years ago here at DUMC that you may remember.

The Ndere Orphans and Parental Care Program was established in 1996 by retired teacher Washington Kaguto, to address the high toll of HIV/AIDS on the community. As HIV/AIDS claimed the lives of more and more parents, the orphan population increased significantly, overwhelming the ability of families to provide for their basic needs. Many of these children were unable to join the school system. Some became child laborers, working on farms or other hard manual labor. These children were at risk of exploitation and abuse. Mr. Kaguto started this program to provide food, clothing and an opportunity for education. He mobilized the community and volunteers, donated land and constructed a mud thatched building. Additional classrooms were eventually begun but not completed.

The program's benefactor passed away in 2016, leaving the orphanage without any consistent funding. The classrooms remain partially completed, with no teaching supplies, no toys or recreational materials, no toilet facilities. They struggle to provide even a morning cup of porridge for the children. The community remains committed and hopeful they will be able to provide a better place for these children.


Since our visit, with just one fundraiser, we have been able to provide for construction of desks and for a daily meal of porridge for the next six months.
