Neema (Grace) Kenya Mission: Joint Partners Medical Clinic



Meet *Joyce and Adan*, founders of the Joint Partners Medical Center in Musasa, Kenya. Joyce, a nurse-midwife, is *Gladys Otieno's sister*! The community had no other health facility, and prior to the opening of their clinic community members would come to Joyce and Adan's home seeking help. Their home became a labor and delivery ward and treatment center. With sheer will and faith, they opened their clinic in January 1999 in a rented room, using cardboard to create examination and treatment rooms. Patients flocked to the clinic, seeking treatment for Malaria, Typhoid and other diseases so rampant in their area. Eventually, Joyce and Adan purchased land and built their current clinic, expanding to include preventive services including maternal-child health care, family planning, and cancer screening.

They have come so far, but the challenges remain significant. The cost of drugs is prohibitive, often absorbed by the Clinic when patients cannot afford treatment, depleting their limited resources. Lack of equipment requires the Clinic to refer patients to facilities outside the community. Lack of funding continues to prevent many women from

seeking treatment for themselves and their children for *preventable, life-threatening illnesses.*

<u>What we have done so far</u>: We provided Joyce a small donation in January, which she used to hold a screening clinic for the children of the community. During the screening, a four year old boy was diagnosed with acute intestinal obstruction. They were able to transfer the child to a nearby mission hospital, where he underwent immediate surgery, saving the boy's life. Joyce wrote us, *"God worked through you in a very mysterious way to save the life of this child."* To which we said, "Amen!"

Last month we sent Joint Partners funds to purchase a blood pressure machine, glucometer, hemometer, diagnostic kits and a baby scale. To us it was a small investment with potential for enormous dividends. To Joyce and Adan, it was another example of God's Neema grace. It is exciting to see DUMC becoming one of the partners in this amazing, life-saving Joint Partners outreach! Asante sana (thank you very much) for all of your support! 7
