# THE BEACON MARCH 2017



### Devoted Servants, Drawn to Jesus, Dedicated to Making Disciples

Dear Fellow Disciples,

The forty days (plus six Sundays) of Lent are about to begin. The forty days remind us of the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted to follow a course different from the course God wanted him to follow. These are days we also are alert to course deviations and seek to get back on course with God. The forty days remind us also of the forty years the Israelites spent wandering in the wilderness. During that time, they learned to trust and obey God and thus found their way to the Promised Land. Through Lenten disciplines, these are days we also learn or relearn how to trust and obey our Lord so we might find our way to the Promised Land.

This holy, penitential season begins with a day of repentance – Ash Wednesday. It is so called because the primary symbol of the day is ashes, smeared in the shape of the cross, upon our foreheads. Ashes are a thousands-of-years-old Biblical symbol of repentance. The burnt remains (in this case from the palms from last Palm Sunday) speak to us of death. We recall the old graveside words, "ashes to ashes and dust to dust," and they are imprinted upon our foreheads with the stark, startling words, "You are dust and to dust you will return." Boom. No sugar coating the truth there.

Why do we do such a depressing and upsetting ritual in the church? It is not just to remind us that we are mortal, although sometimes we need reminding. We all know that one day we will die. We try not to think about it, and we hope that day is a long way off, but we all know that day will come. We don't need some glum pastor smearing ashes on us to know that.

The bigger point is that we will die, AND WITHOUT GOD, there is nothing that can be done about it. We die and, either by cremation or burial, we are reduced to ashes or dust. End of story. Except, when God is involved, the story does not end there. Oh, our mortal bodies still die. But God raises us from the grave and gives us new, eternal life in heaven! This is the ultimate good news of the gospel. Christ died for our sins. Christ rose from the dead. Christ shares his victory over death with us.

This is remarkably good news and we like to celebrate it. Not surprisingly, the church is packed on Easter Sunday – the day of resurrection. Not so much, though, on Ash Wednesday. Undoubtedly, this is because it is far more uplifting to hear brass bands and to see lots of spring flowers and to sing lustily about living forever, than it is to receive ashes and be told you are going to die.

### Pastor's Article (cont'd)

I get that. I do. But here is something to consider. We cannot truly appreciate what an amazing and powerful gift resurrection is until we grapple with just how final and inevitable death is. No one appreciates peace more than those who have actually fought in war. No one appreciates kindness more than those who have mostly been abused. No one appreciates friends more than those who have been very alone. No one appreciates life more than the one who has had a near-death experience. No one appreciates just what Easter is all about more than the one who has stood crying at the altar hearing that they are dust, and because of their sin they are mortal and there is nothing they can do to change that. That is our reality. That is the basic fact of life.

But then we hear that God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believes in him will not perish, but will have eternal life. Then we hear that Jesus took our sin upon himself. Then we hear that Jesus conquered the powers of both sin and death and rose from the grave and that God will raise us, too. This is good news to any who hear it. It is spectacular, astounding, amazing, sensational news to those who have truly grasped the alternative.

Sooooooo, I look forward to seeing you on Easter on April 16, but I also hope to see you on Wednesday, March 1 - Ash Wednesday. You can come for the imposition of ashes at 6:30 am or at noon – on your way to work or during your lunch time. You can come at 7:00 pm for a fuller service of ashes and communion. You pick the time, but come. It will not be uplifting. It will be cleansing. It will rightly begin your forty days in the wilderness preparing you for entrance into the Promised Land.

The holy season of Lent is about to begin. Make it meaningful. Make it count. Yours in Christ, David



### The Baltimore Christian Workcamp

The BCCW was founded by two United Methodist ministers in 1984. In 2017, the week will be July 16 -- 21, our 34th year. There is a kick-off dinner on Sunday evening at Hunt's UMC, the host church. Each work day starts with break-fast prepared by members from a local church at the host church. The volunteers then prepare their own bagged lunches and volunteers go out to sites, with dinner that evening at local churches. All types of work (e.g., ramps, plumbing, electrical, carpentry, roofing, interior and exterior painting, caulking, inside and outside clean-up) are performed by workers of all ages. Sleeping accommodations at the host church can be available only for supervised large groups traveling from out-of-the region. Anyone over 16 and willing to work may register. Fee is \$25 per week, or \$6 per day. Church groups are asked to donate at least \$100 for building materials. (In addition, there are planning meetings held throughout the year at Hunt's Memorial UMC, Towson, MD)
