JOIN US ON A YOUNG-AT-HEART OUTING TO MONOCACY NATIONAL BATTLEFIELD!



Did you know that a crucial Civil War battle was fought practically in our own backyard? You've probably driven by it on your way to Frederick

and never paid any attention to it. Known as "*The Battle that Saved Washington, D.C,*" the Battle of Monocacy was the third and last battle fought against invading Confederate troops. This battle delayed Confederate forces sent to capture Washington, DC and ultimately forced them to withdraw to Virginia.

We will begin our tour of the battlefield at the Visitor Center where a ranger will give us a talk on the history of this important battle. Then we will drive to four key locations on the battlefield where the ranger will meet with us to discuss the significance of these locations: The Best Farm, where the Confederates set up artillery; Worthington Farm, where Confederates formed an attack and which was also used as a field hospital; Thomas Farm, the focal point of the battle; and Gambrill Mill, used by Union troops as a field hospital. We will also have time to explore the museum on the second floor of the Visitor Center. The museum has information and displays about the battle, artifacts found on the grounds and a lovely overlook of the battlefield. Afterward we will have lunch at Monocacy Crossing Restaurant.

How to Help after Cyclone Idai

Sometimes being partners means drying each other's tears, rebuilding lives and homes in the face of devastating disaster, and sharing hope when all seems lost.

As Covenant Partners with the United Methodists in Zimbabwe, the Baltimore-Washington Conference is reaching out in love and action to the people whose lives were uprooted by Cyclone Idai, which swept through Southern Africa on March 14, 2019. livelihoods. Most do not know what happened, they do not know the whereabouts or fate of other family members from their households," said Zimbabwe Episcopal Area Bishop Eben K. Nhiwatiwa. Survivors say the roaring water, wind and rolling stones sounded like a roaring lion.

On April 2, reports from United Methodist communicators in the region indicated the death toll in Zimbabwe was at 415, with at least 200 still missing. In Mozambique, current figures put the death toll at 518, with 56 dead in Malawi. At least 16,000 homes have been destroyed by the storm in Zimbabwe, according to ReliefWeb.

United Nations reports indicate that more than 3 million people in Mozambique, Malawi, and Zimbabwe have been affected by the torrential rains, 1.5 of them children.

The United Methodist Committee on Relief has allocated a \$10,000 grant for immediate, emergency short-term funding to meet basic human needs in Zimbabwe. Mozambique and Malawi also received emergency grants. Needs include water transportation and storage for drinking, cooking, and personal hygiene, along with temporary shelter. The United Methodist Commission on Communications provided about \$5,000 for solar power to enable cell phone charging in the UM mission sites in the impacted areas. This has opened up much-needed communications. There are two ways you can help:

It was a wonderful opportunity to practice our faith in action, by helping those who are in so much need. Ideally we would like for every teen in our youth program to have a chance to participate in this mission and grow their faith journey by serving others in Christ's name.

Site of John T. Baker Home to become Victory Haven – Senior Housing Development

(submitted by Bernardine Beall)



John T. Baker house facing Rt. 108 — back toward the present Damascus UMC. Presently the site of Victory Haven Senior Living Apartments under construction.

John Thomas Baker, born in Kemptown in 1851, was shown in 1870 Census as a teacher boarding in Damascus. In 1875 he married Caroline Mullineaux. John Mount constructed their home on the knoll east of Woodfield Road. The driveway, due to the steepness of the hill, began where Town Spring Road meets 108 and wound around to the back of the house. The Bakers kept a cow, chickens, horses, gardens and fruit trees.

Professor Baker opened the Damascus Grammar School in 1884. The 72 students comprised the largest school in Montgomery County at the time. He developed this into an 8 room High School in 1910 and retired in 1914. He served as a Treasurer of Damascus Church and its Cemetery. He died in 1921 and is buried the church cemetery.

In William's arms is baby Isla (1909-1999) whose mother Isla Young Baker died in childbirth.

William then married Norma Brandenburg. Again widowed, then married Belle Foard. Her name is on a brick from the walkway to our Youth Chapel. Many of the Baker descendants were teachers, down thru Lillian Leatherman, who is now age 102, who married Vernon R. Simpson, history teacher and VP at Damascus High. A few years ago the last fruit tree next to the brick walk was cut down.

The Peck family lived many years in the home. The children were playmates of the Grover Stanley family across Route 108. Phyllis Stanley Walker recalls Dick

Peck was president of DHS Class of '39, and his twin was on early TV advertising his Bob Peck Chevrolet Dealership.

Lightning caused a fire in 1947, necessitating major renovations. The new volunteer fire department fought the fire.

Barbara Cornor (childhood home stands by Cornor Drive and husband Attorney Bob Mcloskey were followed by the Murphy's large family. In 1954 Dr. M. McKendree Boyer purchased the entire lot. Electrician Patrick Via's family was the last to make the knoll their home. The home was torn down. Scrub trees grew. The Boyer Clinic was built in 1964.

May Victory Haven Senior Living Apartments bring more good living to this part of Damascus!
