### Devoted Servants, Drawn to Jesus, Dedicated to Making Disciples

Greetings Friends,

We often speak at church about the call to make disciples. We call this our holy mission in our mission statement which we recite every Sunday, and it is part of our denominational mission statement. As believers, we are charged by God with the responsibility of making disciples of Christ.

Have you ever stopped to think about what that actually means? If I set out to make a cake, I would know what ingredients were needed, how to go about it and, when finished, if I had successfully baked a cake or not. What, though, goes into making a disciple, and how do we go about it, and how do we know if we have successfully made a disciple or not? Perhaps the answers are obvious to you. Perhaps, like me, you are not immediately sure how to answer. This much I know, we cannot make disciples if we do not know what we are making.

Over the next year, in a variety of ways, we will be talking together about discipleship. Just what does it mean to be a disciple? What are we doing that helps shape and develop disciples? Where are we in our own discipleship? The results of our discussions together will be used to help us focus on our ministry, serving as a lens to help us evaluate what we are doing. We can then be sure that when we say on Sunday that we are dedicated to making disciples, we truly are dedicated and we know just what that means. Watch for opportunities to be part of the discussion!

There are some wonderful worship opportunities ahead of us. November 1 is All Saint's Sunday and is always a meaningful and moving time for us to remember and honor those who have gone before and to gather around the table with the communion of saints. Over the next three weeks, we will reflect on the kingdom of heaven. In multiple parables Jesus said, "The kingdom of heaven is like..." and then told a story to help describe the indescribable. Amanda and I will each take a turn with "the kingdom of heaven is like..." theme and then our youth will share their thoughts and ideas. November 29 begins the season of Advent and we will be using music and the arts from different time periods to help tell this story. Of course, we have our traditional Thanksgiving Day service at 9:30 am.

You may notice over the next weeks that there are no boxes of offering envelopes to pick up. This is because in 2016 envelopes will be mailed to you each quarter. ## Between Cultures sends Thanksgiving greetings and love to the DUMC community!

We have had a very eventful Fall this year! In September, Amanda Jones, Eduardo & Memo accompanied six Nicaraguans from La Danta's neighboring community of Dulce Nombre de Jesus (Sweet Name of Jesus) to Boston, Massachusetts to visit their brothers and sisters at Church of the Covenant for two weeks. Between Cultures and the delegates participated in the church's annual retreat, visits to farms, talks on immigration and prison reform, sexual diversity, homelessness, and many more topics near and dear to the active Covenant community. BC and the delegation also led a Sunday church service in the Celebration of the Word style of reflecting on Scripture together, presented the Delegate of the Word movement project and songs, and reflected on the life of Newell Hendricks with his family and friends. We are so grateful to the Covenant congregation for their hard work and planning to make it such a memorable event.

Amanda Jones, Memo & Eduardo then visited McKendree University (a Methodist college located in Lebanon, Illinois that came to Nicaragua this year), giving talks about Between Cultures and Nicaragua. They then took the train up to Milwaukee, Wisconsin, to participate in the Fall Retreat of the Lutheran Campus Ministry at Marquette University. Again, it was a time of sharing about Between Cultures 'work, and giving thanks for the faith communities in the States that are committed to accompanying the struggle of the poor in Nicaragua. In La Danta, there still has been very little rain, so continued prayers are asked for them and all of the farming communities in Central America suffering from the drought. Between Cultures will host the final Biblical Retreat of the year for La Danta and the other communities that they work with in Managua in November.
