Dear Friends,

Halloween is upon us. I know because mixed in with all of the Christmas decorations in the aisles of the big box stores are bags of candy, costumes for children, and spooky decorations for house and yard. 'Tis the season of ghosts, goblins, zombies, and vampires.

There are various traditions as to the origin of Halloween, such as the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain that marked the end of the harvest and the beginning of winter. It was believed that this seasonal transition created a bridge to the world of the dead. More in harmony with western Christianity is the understanding that All Saints Day, a feast day to celebrate the lives of the saints who do not have a specific feast day, falls on November 1, and All Souls Day, a day to remember the faithful who have died recently, falls on November 2. All Hallows Eve, All Hallows Day, and All Souls Day combine for a three-day observance of Allhallowtide. There were many traditions associated with All Hallows Eve (Halloween) eventually morphing into some of the traditions we know such as carving jack-o'-laterns, bonfires, trick-or-treating, pranks, and scary stories. Put most simply, it represents a last fling of the unholy before the day honoring the holy.

Halloween has become a big deal. Commercially it ranks just behind Christmas and many, many people enjoy Halloween parties and costumes and trick-or-treating and putting up decorations. It is a great season for horror film fans and it is fun to walk through communities and see witches and ghosts and black cats and menacing pumpkins.

Because of some of the pagan roots, some Christians hold that we should not honor or celebrate Halloween. I am not one of them. Admittedly, it is not my favorite time. I'm just not a costume guy, but that's me, and I can appreciate how much fun others have. If that's you, God bless. I am all for others enjoying it.

I happen to like the next day, November 1, All Saints Day. Of course, in the Protestant tradition, we do not recognize canonized saints. We do, however, have faith heroes and heroines, which is pretty much the same thing, and it appeals to me to have a day to lift them up and to remember them. Thank heaven that, usually without fanfare or even notice, the holy walk among us because the Lord knows that the unholy also walk among us, often with fanfare and notice. It is good to be reminded that there are those who have and do model faith and mercy and kindness and generosity and grace. The sinister of Halloween make me gasp, but the saints take my breath away.

When the costumes come off, may we all be dressed as saints, walking the path of the holy, bringing blessing and life. Our communities need saints. Why not us?



Stewardship/Finance

Greetings from your Finance Committee!

We are currently developing the church's budget for 2017 and we attempt to reflect our priorities limited by our income. Our budget year runs from January 1 through December 31, and the three largest items in the budget are fixed: salaries, maintenance for the buildings, and the assessment we pay to the broader church.

Over the years, we have learned to rely on a "normal" pattern of contributions that enables us to establish the budget's baseline. We expect to see predictable contributions from January to June, followed by a "summer slump." This is followed by a robust catching-up in September and a predictable pattern from October through December. This year has not followed the predictable pattern and we don't know why. Giving in April & May was way off and the summer slump was actually somewhat less deep this year, possibly held up by enthusiasm generated by the single Sunday morning service. There was no catch-up giving in September and we can't, at this time, know what October, November, and December will bring.

So where are we? We are currently about \$30,000 behind in meeting our obligations.

We would note that we have been very careful managers of our resources. All of the discretionary items, the non-fixed items, are under budget: **we are not overspending.** We very much want to maintain the numerous ministries and programs such as our youth programs, the Charles Wesley Singers, the Stephen Ministry, the Sunday School program, and missionaries working in Central America and at home. They are at the heart of DUMC. These ministries serve our congregation, our community, and beyond.

We know that these are rather uncertain economic times that we live in, both as a Nation and as individuals & families. Perhaps the current economic stresses explain, in part, the decline in giving. We would hope that each of you will thoughtfully and prayerfully review your giving and, if possible, increase it so that we can close our budget shortfall and finish the year free of unpaid bills. Thank you for your attention.
