The Importance of "Face Time"

I have spent time in the month of September visiting a number of our shut-ins and older members of our congregation. These visits have reminded me about the importance of "face time"—that is, time spent in the real presence of another person, face-to-face, as opposed to via phone or computer screen.

One of the true privileges of being a pastor is being welcomed into people's homes. I learn so much about someone by visiting them at home. Not only do I get to hear their story, I am often treated to a look around their home—not just at rooms, but at objects that are important to people, like old photographs, items that belonged to a long-deceased parent or spouse, photos of grandchildren or items made by them. These precious items have stories to tell.

Visiting with people can be an emotional experience. Being present with another person as they share about the important things in their lives is an honor. Sometimes we may each have a tear in our eye as we reflect on people who are no longer with us or other experiences of loss. At other times tears may be due to having laughed so hard at a story one of us has told.

I always like to close with prayer, preferably holding hands, as I remind us both that wherever two or more followers of Christ are gathered, Christ is in our midst. I give thanks for the new relationships that are being formed as we meet and share our stories and memories (including stories about "old Damascus" and DUMC). And I ask that God bless and keep those whom I have visited.

Being present with one another reminds us of God's presence with us as well as the fact that we are created in the image of God. When we visit together, God is with us and within us.

At present, we do not have formal small-group gatherings scheduled for people to meet Pastor B and me. Many of these visits have taken place spontaneously over the summer or as people have called to schedule meetings at church or invited us to their homes or small groups. However, if you have not had a chance and would like to meet with one or both of us, please call the church office to schedule a time to get together. Or simply invite us to your small group/ministry area. Or gather some friends at your home and invite us over—we're flexible! I feel so blessed and give thanks to God daily as I become a part of the DUMC community and get to know many of you. This is a marvelous congregation, filled with caring Christians who want to make a difference in our community and the world. God is good!

Winter trip to Nicaragua on hold

Because of the political turmoil in Nicaragua and any resolution is unknown at the moment, DUMC will not have the annual trip this winter. Below if the latest from **Between Cultures** about their visit to DUMC's sister church in LaDanta.

The attendance was about 24 people. Flor was baking and Chica was having some health issues. Don Jerónimo is in poor health. He no longer feels like walking without a stick. He also suffers from deafness. He can walk on even ground but not on rough surfaces. If he tries walking on uneven surfaces he goes sideways. Some children have been sick with pneumonia.

Celso and Marina were in Rio San Juan for 15 days visiting their son.

The fields are being prepared waiting for the rains. The fields had already been prepared but the grass grew back while waiting for the first rains and we have to do the work again.

There is little corn. People have to buy it. Since it was not planted during the first half of the rainy season now there is no corn. This time it rained a little at first but the last rains have been delayed. The corn has cost 600 córdobas. Now in Somotillo you can find it in between 800 to 900 córdobas. The trucks came early to buy corn and many of the community sold believing that what they had left was going to be enough but it (continued) $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow \Rightarrow \Rightarrow 8$ was not like that.

A problem very felt by the community is that many robberies have been happening. They will rob anything: chickens, chicks, and ducks to horses. It's like there's no law. Due to this situation there will be an assembly with the police to expose the situation. Possibly there will be patrol as it is a problem that is repeated in other nearby communities. In the past, the community has been voluntarily vigilant. One factor that affects robberies is that the border with Honduras is close and the stolen goods are traded in the other country and it is difficult to pursue them to that place.

It has also been noted the presence of motorcycles at night in the community without knowing the reason for their presence. The mode of operation of those who make these assaults is in gangs of about 6 people. Some of them watch while others are stealing the animals or things.

The project to improve the electric service has been delayed but it is sure that it will be carried out. The holes where the poles have been installed have already been drilled and the posts have been taken to the community.

As for the ceramic floor project for the church, there is still a lack of people who contribute the 100 córdobas. They were asked to make the budget soon so we can disburse the money that we have in Entre Culturas.

Needs for the ministry of Nan McCurdy and Miguel Mairena in Mexico

- 1) To upgrade 2 pickup trucks for used trucks that are more gas efficient and in need of fewer repairs. Many tasks require trucks related to farming.
- 2) Providing a strawbale home for a woman who is living in a home made of cardboard, reeds, and sticks which floods in the rainy season. They cannot afford more. Total cost: \$5,558.00.

Like the family of Mrs. Julia Palma, many families are in need of a better home. A real house! This is why GYTTE, Give Ye Them To Eat, through its Community Development program, helps these families in need. GYTTE provides the training and resources so that each family can help in the construction of a strawbale house. These families have the desire to improve their lives, unfortunately they do not have the economic resources since the work in the field is arduous, but with very little pay. But they do have the desire to work and learn to make their home. GYTTY tries to help them build, in addition to the strawbale house, an ecological dry toilet and a wood burning stove. The objective of our community development is that these families can not only change the place where they live, but have a change of life. We involve our other programs: providing training in health topics such as "Hand and Feet Washing", "General Hygiene", "Dental Hygiene", etc.; and if the family is even more interested, they are given advice about "Terracing", "Gaviones", "Compost Express", etc. (methods for making more out of a small plot of land). Training helps them develop in an integral way. We hope your congregation considers supporting this ministry. We are hoping to raise the necessary funds through the congregations that support us.

- To those Trustees who did the outside painting at Harwood House.
- To those who supported the ministries of caring for orphans and providing for the clinic in Kenya through the June yard sale and the August concessions at "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat."
- To the 11 person team who worked with Habitat in July. Their work was as follows:

House 1 – We installed kitchen cabinets in this house (unfortunately, there was a disconnect between the plans and the delivered cabinets so we couldn't finish the project).

House 2 – We installed vinyl siding on almost all the house and installed kitchen cabinets (unfortunately, there was a disconnect between the plans and the delivered cabinets so we couldn't finish the cabinets on this house either).

House 3 – We put the end gables or "rakes" up on the existing roof trusses and then put up the plywood sheeting on the entire roof.

House 4 – We leveled out the ground, laid gravel, plastic sheeting, and rigid foam insulation on the ground in the basement crawl space. We then installed the rigid foam insulation on the walls of the basement. We applied tar (well, technically, it probably wasn't "tar", but that's what everyone calls it) to waterproof ("parge") the exterior of the basement. By the end of the week, we had the floor joists, and the plywood decking (subfloor) installed for the first floor of the house. We also laid drainage pipe in the ditches around the house and filled in the ditches with gravel after the pipe was laid.


QUARTERLY OFFERING ENVELOPES


