Grace and Peace,

The summer season has come to a close. I hope you had opportunity to relax a bit and enjoy a slower season and get some refreshment for your souls. Now the time has come to get reenergized as work, school, and church get back into full swing.

In that spirit we are beginning a worship series called Reinforce based on words beginning with "re." How many can there be? Well, I used three in the opening paragraph of this letter and our theme title is another. Words you will hear between now and All Saint's Day are: rebuild, revive, rejoice, reaffirm, remember, refresh, reply, revere, reform, and re-gift. There are more, but we will leave it at that.

Speaking of "re" words, this year marks the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. We will be honoring that on October 29. In addition, I will be leading a five-week study about the Reformation in my Sunday morning class and on Wednesday, September 27 and the four Wednesdays in October, the 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th. The Wednesday study will be at 7:00 pm.

Another "re" word is recommit. The terrible happenings in Charlottesville, VA this summer serves as a vivid reminder of our need to constantly recommit ourselves to preach, teach, and model Christ's grace and love for all. The situation in Charlottesville was dramatic and stunning and shameful. It was not, however, unique. Racial hate and tension have been part of our history and continues to manifest itself in multiple ways, usually not as dramatically as in Charlottesville, but equally disturbing.

Our bishop, LaTrelle Easterling, has reminded us of our baptismal vows, the promise to renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and to repent of our sin, and the promise to accept the freedom and power God gives us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves. This promises require ongoing effort and vigilance for the enemies of our Lord never tire in their efforts. We have a different story to tell, a different way to live to model. If the ways of the world include violence and hate, the ways of the Christian include peace and love. I pray that our church will shine that beacon, bringing light into darkness.

Sunday School for all ages resumes (another "re" word) on September 10. Here we learn the scripture and the ways of the Lord which help us to fulfill our baptismal vows. Several adult classes are available. I encourage you to choose one that fits you.

Thanks for your patience as we continue with the sanctuary refreshing. The work is progressing nicely and we are close to the

# Steam into History on a Fall Foliage Train Ride October 14, 2017

Some of the local history is about Josiah Gitt, a dry goods merchant from Hanover, Pennsylvania who owned a farm in York County. He, along with other farmers throughout the region suffered greatly in June 1863 as passing soldiers took animals and other supplies from the surrounding countryside. Gitt and others later sued the federal government for the damages done to their properties. Hear his stories about life during these challenging times while riding on the Northern Central Railway.


